

Moscow mayor Sergei Sobyenin [approved a law](#) on fines for violating the self-isolation regime. The law came into force on April 1.

Fines for Moscow residents for violation of isolation regime:

- 4,000 rubles for the first violation;
- 5,000 rubles for repeated violation or for violation with the use of a vehicle that is seized and placed in a penalty parking lot.

Fines for refusing to suspend the activities of various facilities and for refusing to suspend events:

30,000-40,000 rubles for officials;

40,000-50,000 rubles for repeated violation for officials;

200,000-300,000 rubles for legal entities in violation of the ban on mass events, as well as stores and catering facilities that violate the instructions of the Moscow authorities;

300,000-500,000 rubles for repeated violation for legal entities.

Sanctions will be applied if the violation does not contain a "criminal offense" or administrative under the Code of Administrative Offenses of the Russian Federation.

All previously imposed restrictions will be extended until May 1, 2020. The permit regime for moving around the city has not yet been introduced.

From [April 1, article 6.3 of the Code of Administrative Offenses](#) establishes [administrative responsibility](#) for violation of sanitary rules and hygienic standards, failure to comply with sanitary-hygienic and anti-epidemic measures "under the emergency situation or when there is a threat of the spread of a disease that poses a danger to others".

Violations entail the imposition of an administrative fine on:

- citizens – in the amount of 15,000 to 40,000 rubles;
- officials – from 50,000 to 150,000 rubles;
- individual entrepreneurs – from 50,000 to 150,000 rubles or suspension of activity for up to 90 days;
- legal entities – from 200,000 to 500,000 rubles or suspension of activity for up to 90 days.
