

Moscow mayor Sergei Sobyenin announced the first stage of easing restrictions in Moscow. The mayor's statement is [available on his website](#).

Starting May 25, the work of the multifunctional centers (MFC) "My Documents" is resumed. However, only those that are located in the most densely populated areas with good transport accessibility will open. Moscow citizens will be able to get 150 different services that cannot be processed electronically.

Visiting the "My documents" centers will be possible only by appointment on the portal mos.ru. Public services will be provided in accordance with sanitary and epidemiological safety standards. Employees of the centers and visitors will be required to wear personal protective equipment: masks and gloves. The temperature will be measured at the entrance, and disinfection will be carried out regularly indoors.

In addition, carsharing will resume working from May 25. People will be able to rent a car for at least five days. To move around the city, the client must have a digital pass. The mayor of Moscow noted that such a regime of operation is not carsharing in the full sense of the word, but it can become an acceptable solution for operators and citizens.

Also, from May 27, only Moscow digital passes will be valid for moving around Moscow. Residents of other regions can apply for them starting May 21.

Mr. Sobyenin added that it is too early to return employees to their offices. Therefore, all city organizations are required to maintain the maximum percentage of employees working remotely.
