

On July 24, the Russian government announced the partial resumption of flights from August 1 (Order [No. 1915-r](#) on amendments to order No. 635-r dated March 16, 2020). So far, this applies only to three countries: the UK, Turkey, and Tanzania, and negotiations are underway with 30 other countries.

According to Order No. 1915-r, citizens of the UK, Tanzania and Turkey, as well as persons with a residence permit in these countries, are allowed to enter the Russian Federation through air checkpoints. **Please note that citizens of other countries who do not have a residence permit in the UK, Tanzania and Turkey will not be able to enter Russia through these countries.**

Air checkpoints are airports of international air traffic. The above-mentioned persons are also allowed to issue visas at the diplomatic and consular offices of the Russian Federation on the territory of these countries.

According to the Deputy Prime Minister Tatiana Golikova, flights from Russia starting August 1 will be operated from airports in Moscow, the Moscow region, St. Petersburg and Rostov-on-don to London, Zanzibar, Ankara and Istanbul. Flights to Antalya, Bodrum and Dalaman are scheduled from August 10. Rosaviatsia will send notification telegrams about the resumption of flights to airlines.
