

Plan for gradual lifting of restrictions

On May 6, the President of the Russian Federation held a meeting with the Government members on measures to exit the regime of forced restrictions.

The head of Rospotrebnadzor, Anna Popova introduced a plan for a phased lockdown exit.

Stage 1

- allow to go for walks with children and for sports outdoors
- open trade and services facilities of a limited area

Stage 2

- allow families to walk outside
- open retail outlets of a larger area with a limitation of the simultaneous servicing of visitors
- open educational institutions

Stage 3

- open all stores and catering establishments
- open parks and recreation areas subject to the rules of social distancing

The decision to move from one stage to another will be made by regional governments based on the epidemiological situation.

Complete removal of restrictions is possible only if a vaccine is developed.

Removal of restrictions in Moscow

Moscow mayor Sergei Sobyenin said that on May 12, all industrial and construction enterprises will be allowed to work.

The mayor called the removal of restrictions from service companies premature.

The regime of self-isolation in Moscow after May 12 will not be weakened.
